

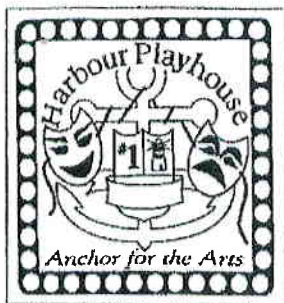

It is the desire of THE BAY AREA HARBOUR PLAYHOUSE to solicit support in the way of "FUNDING FOR THE ARTS" from the City of Dickinson. We are chartered by the State of Texas as a NON PROFIT COMMUNITY THEATRE with a 501©3 tax exempt designation by the United States Government. We are governed by a set of officers and fourteen board members which meets monthly. We are an ALL VOLUNTEER ORGANIZATION. NO ONE IS PAID.

This year marks our TWENTIETH YEAR of operation here in Dickinson (1991-2011) in our renovated 1941 "Hollywood" movie house. Some of you may not have had the opportunity to examine our facilities or our activities. Perhaps a description is called for.

PROGRAM OF WORK:

THEATRE PRODUCTIONS

We produce 10 Major Productions per year, alternating on The Main Deck (downstairs-seating 140 people) and The Top Side (upstairs-seating 64 people). Each show is performed twelve times (4 weekends-Fri.&Sat. at 8:00 P.M. and Sun. at 2:30 P.M.) Each show involves from 12 to 40 people (actors, director, stage manager, props, costumes, dancers, singers, stage hands, musicians). These people come from all the cities around the area .

CLASSES IN THEATRE ARTS (ACTING) AND MUSICAL THEATRE

_____ We offer Spring and Fall semesters of 8 weeks with one and one-half hour per week with a Student Production at the end in Beginning and Advanced Acting and Beginning and Advanced Musical Theatre. (about 40+ students per semester)

In the Summer we offer two Drama Camps (one in June of 4 weeks and one in July of 4 weeks). The students come at 10:00 A.M. and leave at 2:00 P.M.. For two weeks they study and rehearse a children's play and perform the last two weeks for Day Care Centers who come in their little buses. The students come from all the cities in the area.(about 40+ students per camp)

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

_____ We are one of the few Non Profits in the area for students who have been given tickets for misconduct to perform their "hours of community service". They perform a variety of tasks around the theatre: building sets, take down sets, clean, change light bulbs, paint sets, fold programs, vacuum floors. They have to be supervised and they must sign in and out to get their ticket cleared. Some find it interesting and come back as volunteers. We contribute tickets to all local school and non-profit organizations for their fundraisers and festivals. We make presentations several times during the year to local schools who are having career fairs.

ECONOMIC IMPACT – Actors, students, parents all eat and shop in the Dickinson area.

REASONS FOR REQUESTING FUNDS

1. The "CUT BACK" at NASA has lost us some of our actor as well as some of our subscribers. Some had to move away some lost their jobs.
2. High cost of production:
Royalties from play publishers went from \$50. per performance to \$75. each which raised the price to \$75.@ night for a total of \$900.00 for the run of a show. Musicals went from \$2,000. to \$5,000. as well as lumber, paint hardware.
3. High cost of electricity (the building is all electric) 7 air conditioner/heaters Cooler months - \$1,500.00 hot months - \$2,300.00.
4. Deterioration of facilities. After 20 years of hard constant wear our curtains are Threãbare and shabby and our lighting and sound equipment needs help.
